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To planners for faith-based conferences, workshops, masterminds and retreats:

Alongside the examples from my book, *The Art of Breakthrough: Collaborating on Audacious Undertakings*, I have developed a few distinct presentations. 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Book review: The Art of Breakthrough, Ephesians 4, and the Church

Steve Staten's book, *The Art of Breakthrough: Collaborating on Audacious Undertakings*, is a masterful study based on empirical evidence that highlights what humankind can accomplish when people learn how to come together and truly collaborate. Although it directly addresses secular applications, it has profound implications for churches and charities at this very time. In the church affiliation where Steve and I both teach we participated in a decisive rejection of top-down command hierarchy, following its short-sightedness and abuses. The last couple of decades have been marked by healing, rebuilding trust and relationships, and striving to understand a more comprehensive and mature ministry model.

The Scriptures are filled with metaphors to help us understand God's divine intent for his people: the church as family, kingdom, bride, etc. We likewise have various models for how we are to function together: servant leadership, a body, and appointed positions of leadership such as elder, evangelist, teacher, and deacon. Each of these metaphors and models serves God's people to cast vision and assist us as we strive for ecclesial health. In our present climate and desire to mature, Ephesians 4:11–16 may be the most important visual we need. Christ gave his people various talents to collaborate in maturing one another as the church grows and builds itself up in love, each part doing their work. Staten's book models this critical biblical principle, showing us what can happen when clear goals, proper alignment, mutual respect, team effort, and shared responsibility guide an organization.

What could happen in churches and faith-based charities if the principles taught in Ephesians 4 and modeled in *The Art of Breakthrough* were utilized? What could be accomplished in the name of God if the whole body, built up in love, put their unique talents to work? How different could we be if evangelists, teachers, elders and leaders of charities saw their primary goal as empowering this type of collaboration? Staten's work is timely for those of us who dream of vibrant and mature churches, achieving God's will "on earth as it is in heaven." I wholeheartedly recommend reading *The Art of Breakthrough* through the lens of Ephesians 4. It has the potential of creating a breakthrough for us.
